
The day was filled with fun activities and real-life stories and definitely helped us build a richer picture of what life was like in Tudor England!






## Year 4 Trip to Kew Gardens

So far this year, we have served over 3000 guests and provided enough food to feed over 7000 adults and children (as well as providing toiletries and hygiene products). We simply would not be able to provide this high level of support to so many people experiencing financial hardship without the very kind donations we continue to receive from amazing schools like yours. 




## Cycle to School Week

Well done to everyone who made the effort to scoot or cycle to school during Cycle Week in September.




















## **Shooting Star Hospice**


