

Recently in the press there have been many reports of schools issuing warnings to parents about the negative impact that this Netflix programme and game, also available on Youtube and Tiktok, is having on young children. This has included children acting out this game at playtimes. Whilst thankfully at Ashton House we have not had children re-enacting scenes from this show, we have had a child referencing watching it.

From a child safeguarding standpoint Squid Game with its violent content, sexual references and language is wholly unsuitable watching for age 11 and under. We would all agree that impressionable minds cannot distinguish between fantasy and reality and have to be protected. Keeping Children Safe in Education (2021) references the need to protect children from significant harm, both physical and emotional as well as ensuring they grow up in circumstances consistent with safe and effective care.

To this end I would like to remind you to maintain your parental control filtering at home and children only watch age appropriate content.
